Town Hall Broadmeadows: A blank canvas to make your own

Town Hall Broadmeadows has been a fixture in the landscape of Melbourne's north for more than half a century. A \$23 million refurbishment will see it enter a new and exciting chapter in its history.

It was November 1964.

The Beatles had just swept through Melbourne on their world tour, Dawn Fraser had won Olympic gold in the 100-metre freestyle for the third time in Tokyo, and Ron Barassi had captained Melbourne just weeks before to a thrilling Grand Final win against Collingwood.

In Melbourne's northern outskirts, the burgeoning suburb of Broadmeadows was facing unprecedented growth, as baby boomers chased the dream of a new home in the aftermath of the Second World War.

In the 20 years prior, more than 15,000 people had moved into the suburb - most spurred on by the promise of a spacious precast concrete house on a large block, where they could raise a young family.

To meet that growth, the former City of Broadmeadows embarked on an ambitious development - Broadmeadows Town Hall. Built at a cost of £450,000 - or approximately \$6.2 million in today's money - the Town Hall was one of the largest buildings of its type in Victoria at the time, heralding an exciting future for Melbourne's north.

Immigrants from England, Ireland, Scotland, Italy, Hungary, Sweden and Poland joined forces with Australian workers to construct the building over a period of 14 months.

More than 645,000 bricks, 2,220 tonnes of concrete and 300 tonnes of steel were used to develop the new building.

When former Opposition Leader Arthur Calwell officially opened the new venue to much fanfare, he described it as a magnificent hall that had no equal in Melbourne.

It was front page news across Melbourne's newspapers, and those who had the courage and foresight to embark on the project were recognised and congratulated. Over the next 50 years the Town Hall grew into an iconic landmark for the community.

From weddings and debutante balls, gala dinners, cocktail parties, school dances, concerts, parties and an AC/DC gig – you name it, the Town Hall has seen it.

Those events marked the milestones that still hold a special place in the hearts of many.

A bright vision for the future

In 2019, Town Hall Broadmeadows is undergoing a multimillion dollar makeover that will see the venue enter an exciting new chapter in its history.

Hume City Council, with the support of the Victorian Government, has invested \$23 million towards the redevelopment, which is scheduled for completion in October 2019.

Council has a bold vision for the future of Town Hall Broadmeadows - we want the venue to reclaim its title as an events leader in Melbourne's north.

We've honoured the building's unique history by restoring key architectural design features while transforming our interior to provide a vibrant and contemporary space for today.

Its grand façade, iconic red brickwork, floor-toceiling windows and mountain grey gum floors have been painstakingly restored by hand.

The renovated venue will include a main hall, conference and seminar facilities, meeting rooms, a bar, exhibition areas, a coworking space, art gallery and commercial offices.

Catering for up to 500 people seated and 800 people cocktail style, our expansive Main Hall space will provide a blank canvas for guests to make their own.

Conveniently located close to Melbourne Airport, and just 15 kilometres from Melbourne's central business district, we're well supported by public transport links, major freeways and arterial roads.



Town Hall Broadmeadows is a versatile venue with expansive contemporary spaces that can be tailored to bring any event to life.

The Main Hall

Catering for up to 500 people seated and up to 800 people standing, the Main Hall will be tailored to host a wide range of private, business and community events.

Located on the first floor, the Main Hall has a total floor space of 600m2 and is capable of hosting banquet, conference, theatre, cocktail and trade style modes.

The space is supported with the latest audio and visual technology including state-of-the-art presentation screens, lighting and speakers to bring every event to life. Flexible staging options are also available.

Key original features of the room have been painstakingly restored, including the large period floor-to-ceiling windows, mountain grey gum timber floors and the balcony.

Our bar and kitchens adjoin the space, providing direct service access, while a lift is available for operational set up and pack down from the ground floor.

The Blue Lounge

Meeting rooms

The Blue Lounge will provide a touch of glamour to the revitalisation of the Town Hall. Sophisticated and atmospheric, it will offer a place to celebrate in style.

Ideal for events catering for 50 to 100 guests, the lounge is adorned with blue velvet drapes and original exposed brick walls, a beautifully restored upright piano, and a large suspended timber sculpture by artist Robbie Rowlands.

Located on the second floor, it provides direct access to the balcony and a bird's eye view of the Main Hall.

The Bar

Ideal for arrival and pre-dinner drinks or events catering for 100 to 150 guests, The Bar will be equipped with a beer tapping system, post mix machine, commercial fridges, cocktail blenders, coffee machines and glass and dishwashers.

The bar can supply tapped and bottled beer, a wide selection of wines, spirits and cocktails, coffee, tea and post mix soft drink.

Our full service bar is located on the first floor and provides direct entry to the Main Hall. There are four meeting rooms within the Town Hall, catering for groups of six to 20 people.

Located on the first and second floors, the rooms have presentation and teleconferencing capability, wifi connectivity and the latest in audio visual technology.

Ideal as breakout spaces during business events or for a range of meetings, the rooms will be available for hire seven days a week.


The Gallery



Our dedicated coworking space for startups and small businesses, StartNorth, is located on our ground floor.



Our kitchens have been designed to accomodate large scale, end-to-end food preparation, cooking and service for a wide range of events.

Hume City Council engaged external hospitality consultants to assist with the functional design of a primary and secondary kitchen that will allow for the best use of available space.

Located on the first floor with direct service entry points to our Main Hall and Bar, our kitchens are fitted with commercial catering equipment from leading manufacturers to support onsite preparation and service.

Primary Kitchen

The primary kitchen has a total floor area of 115m2 and is our main kitchen space.

It is equipped with:


Cool and Dry Food Storage

Our full-service bar is located on the first floor and provides direct entry to the Main Hall.




The bar can supply tapped and bottled beer, a wide selection of wines, spirits and cocktails, coffee, tea and post mix soft drink.


This space is ideal for small functions in their own right, can be expanded to incorporate The Blue Lounge and for and post event drinks, allowing the Main Hall to be closed off as required.

- Glass racks and storage compartments.









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Precinct Map




Ground Floor Plan

Hume City Council is one of Australia's leading local government organisations, providing over 100 services for our community each year.

Our organisation

Located just 15 kilometres north of the centre of Melbourne, Hume City Council is one of the fastest growing and most culturally-diverse communities in Australia.

Spanning a total area of 504 square kilometres, Hume City is built around the established suburbs of Broadmeadows, Tullamarine and Gladstone Park in the south, the developing residential suburbs of Craigieburn. Greenvale. Mickleham, Kalkallo and Roxburgh Park in the north-east and the Sunbury township in the north-west.

We are an employer of choice to more than 1,500 people, who provide more than 100 different services to our community each year.

Our organisation is led by a Chief Executive Officer and Executive Management Team, who oversee the planning and delivery of Council's programs, projects and services.

Eleven democratically-elected Councillors work closely with the Executive Management Team to set the annual directions and strategic priorities for the City.

Council is responsible for more than \$3 billion in assets and will invest a further \$73 million towards new capital projects in 2018/19.

Council's 2018/19 Budget includes total projected income of \$403 million and an operating expenditure of \$246 million, generating a surplus of \$157 million.

Facility management model

Council has a proven track record in managing a wide range of public venues, including large regional function centres, community and leisure centres, libraries and public halls.

Our Facilities Team oversees the operational management of our public facilities, including the Hume Global Learning Centres in Broadmeadows, Craigieburn and Sunbury (opening in mid-2019).

A new team of highly experienced staff is currently being assembled for the future management of Town Hall Broadmeadows.

The team will work with Council's senior management team to set the strategic direction and priorities for the business.

The business areas Council will be responsible for under the management model include:

- Marketing and promotions;
- Lead generation and sales;
- Strategy and business development;
- Events management;
- Customer experience management; and
- Venue operations.

Marketing and promotions

Council will lead the development and delivery of an overarching marketing, promotions and sales strategy for the Town Hall.

Key areas of focus include:

- Management of a business website;
- Social media strategy and content;
- Electronic Direct Marketing campaigns;
- Development of promotional video, multimedia, photography and design;
- Development of a wide range of publications including brochures, newsletters, menus and flyers; •
- Outreach and promotions;
- Advertising; and
- Media management.

Lead generation and sales

Council will be responsible for tactical sales planning and execution, and inbound and outbound sales management for the facility.

This includes price positioning, invoicing and administration of accounts.

Strategy and business development

Council will lead the strategic planning and coordination of business development activities that builds a strong Town Hall Broadmeadows brand and business model, with an emphasis on a positive customer experience and sustained business growth.

Events management

Council will be the strategic and operational lead on events delivered at the Town Hall and will work in colloboration with our Catering Services Provider to determine responsibilities for each event as required.

Customer experience management

The facility management team will take responsibility for all customer relationships, providing end-to-end support and advice throughout all stages of the event planning process and will act as a single-point of contact for all customer enquiries.

Venue operations

Council's facility management operations team will be responsible for the set up and pack down of events (including chairs, tables and other furniture), technical support for AV, as well as wayfinding and guest greeting services.



Infrastructure and equipment

- Kitchens and Bar – our kitchens and bar are fitted with commercial catering equipment from leading manufacturers to support onsite preparation and service. Additional loose wares or specialist equipment may need to be sourced by the service provider.
- Storage Back of house storage includes cool and dry storerooms. refrigerators, pantry and storage racks.
- Crockery, cutlery and glassware – Most crockery, cutlery and glassware for guest use is provided by Council, however some specialist items will need to be provided by the service provider. Full details will be provided at Tender stage.

Council seeks responses from suitably qualified and experienced service providers for catering at Town Hall Broadmeadows.

Services scope

Council's intention is to award either a single Service Provider, or a Panel of Service Providers, an agreement that incorporates:

Food

- Food menu development
- Food production; and
- Food supply and service.

Liquor and beverage

- Liquor and beverage menu development
- Liquor supply and service; and Non-alcoholic beverage supply and
- service.

In appointing a single service provider or panel of service providers, Council may elect to award the complete management of food, liquor and beverage, or food only.

Expressions of Interest

During the Expressions of Interest stage, Council seeks responses from Service Providers who can:

- Provide a proposal that demonstrates their ability to service part, or all aspects of the scope of services, incorporating the business overview and venue capacity
- Demonstrate a commitment and ability to work in collaboration with Council over the Contract Term to deliver exceptional functions at Town Hall Broadmeadows
- Enhance the reputation of Town Hall Broadmeadows through the delivery of catering services for commercial and internal stakeholder functions and events
- Mobilise a catering team who will work collaboratively with Council over the Contract Term to continuously seek improvements and innovate with guality service and enhanced customer experience outcomes
- Collaborate with the venue's operations team in the delivery of high quality bespoke events; and
- Support local suppliers and businesses.

Applicants are encouraged to submit:

- A proposal or any other relevant attachments, including sample menus and pricing structures
- Case studies or links to support their submission
- How the management of the agreement could be structured, in particular proposed commercial/financial arrangements between Council and the Service Provider.

Menu packages

Menu packages should be tailored to suit the market demand of the business, catering for full sit down meals, cocktail or buffet options that incorporate breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Menus should be developed to ensure competitive pricing and market appeal and appeal to low, mid and high price points.

A discount structure for internal events coordinated by Hume City Council and the service provider should also be considered.

Catering options could include, but are not limited to: breakfast menus, half and full day menus, conference menus, cocktail menus, wedding and gala event menus.

hire rates and packages.

To ensure Town Hall Broadmeadows is competitive in the marketplace, Hume City Council has undertaken detailed financial modelling and benchmarking.

The utilisation and current pricing of Council's existing facilities has also been referenced.

Council proposes a flexible fee structure that incorporates a mix of venue hire and event packages that strike a balance between best commercial returns and affordability.

Room Hire Rates

In line with Council's existing pricing structure for venue hire across our community facilities, a three-tiered pricing model has been set for Town Hall Broadmeadows.

Hire rates will be set each financial year and incorporate Corporate, Government and Community categories. Internal bookings are charged at the community rate.

Packages will be placed within a discretionary price range, allowing Council to market the packages at key times of the year, to both capitalise on periods of high demand and activate the venue during guieter months.

Marketing and sales approach

Hume City Council will roll out a targeted schedule of strategic marketing, promotions and sales campaigns from April 2019 to raise awareness and generate new business leads for the venue. The strategy will use online, social and printed communications.

Brand Launch April-June 2019

The first critical milestone is to relaunch the Town Hall Broadmeadows brand.

This will introduce the venue as a new leader in the marketplace, build customer awareness and generate initial leads for the business.

The brand will be launched to existing customers of Council's community facilities, prior to a major public launch across digital, social and print channels.

Market Penetration Campaign

June-August 2019

Targeted introductory pricing offers will be rolled out across key target markets, including:

- Weddings
- Corporate events; and
- Private events.

This strategy aims to capitalise on off-the-plan interest.

Grand Opening Sales Campaign

September-December 2019

A three-month Grand Opening Sales Campaign will showcase the venue in a fully operational state.
